#### TREASURER'S REPORT

#### MAY 9, 2022

#### FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

A meeting was held involving our previous Treasurer and current Bookkeeper, both of whom are professional accountants, to rectify the problems with the March 31st financial statements presented at the April board meeting. These were fixed by adding Balance Sheet accounts for deferred revenues. The revised statements, as presented at the SGM on April 24th, are attached.

The financial statements for April 30<sup>th</sup> are not yet available due to a large backlog of transaction entries caused by the current flurry of membership renewals. The amount of cash in our bank operating account increased greatly to \$59,420 at the end of April and is currently (as of May 6<sup>th</sup>) over \$75,000.

As reported at last month's meeting, the \$25,000 grant from our successful NHSP grant application was received in early April. Orders have been placed with suppliers for both the sprinkler system upgrade and the battery-powered lawnmower aspects of the approved project.


